PEN PALS: A pilot project for six Episcopal Schools in the Diocese of Texas to learn more about and communicate with the children in corresponding schools in the Diocese of Southern Malawi. SIMPLE GIFTS FOR ORPHAN CARE

WATER FOR MALAWI

EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are based on academic performance and financial need for boys and girls, who have completed one of the four Anglican primary schools, to attend Trinity Anglican Secondary School, a boarding school operated by the Diocese of Southern Malawi. Over 2,500 students are attending one of four primary Anglican schools in rural areas. An "average" primary student is one of six children in his or her household, in which their source of income is agricultural labor of \$1 per day. Education past the primary grades is optional and there are no secondary schools in the rural

areas and so graduates of the rural primary schools are financially prohibited from attending high school. Education benefits the person learning and the community in which they live. A \$1,250 scholarship covers the cost of tuition, room, board, books, paper, and uniforms for one year. **For more information and to donate go to www.WarmHeartInternational.org**
